

EUP Report BIANNUAL REFLECTIONS

Fellow Members,

It's hard to believe we are halfway through this league year! We have so much to be proud of as women of the Junior League of St. Petersburg. Our Management Team has worked dutifully to create an Annual Plan that focuses on giving back to our community through volunteer engagements, enhancing the member experience through social events and Development efforts that will create financial stability for many years to come.

Our year kicked off with our annual back-to-school Care Fair, which was able to distribute 1,100 backpacks, administer 158 medical exams and 86 dental exams. Our Kids Create Committee created 600 crafts with children throughout the day, and our Literacy Committee gave out 850 books to kids of all ages.

Our Community Council has worked hard to fill our league calendar with many volunteer shifts to support our St. Pete community (over 30 so far this year!) We have partnered with organizations like Clothes to Kids, Girls on the Run, Ronald McDonald House, Feeding Tampa Bay and more! Our volunteer opportunities are part of what makes me so proud to be part of this organization. Right after Hurricane Ian hit, our members sprang into action to support the Junior League of Ft. Myers after the devastation the storm caused. It warmed my heart to see the love and care we extended to our neighboring communities.

Our members have been engaged in so many ways in a short six months. From our clusters in August, that included fun events like spinning at Rush Cycle, to wine tasting at Lolitas, to jam-packed GMM's with presentations from Evara Health and League of Women's Voters. I enjoy seeing each of you attend these events and LOVE getting to know you! We welcomed an incredible new Provisional class in May and continue to offer member interest groups to highlight different avenues to connect with fellow league members.

The Development Council created spooky-themed ways to raise funds for the league in the month of October. We held our first ever dog costume contest, Hocus Pocus movie night at Green Bench Brewing and a new favorite ghost tour. These effective and fun fundraisers were the perfect way to enjoy fall while bringing critical dollars into the league to support our programs.

As I reflect on what has been accomplished, and look to the next six months, I am so grateful for each of you and the commitment you have to the Junior League of St. Petersburg. General Membership Meeting Ad Hoc Committee

The General Membership Meeting Ad Hoc Committee started meeting this summer to review and create optimal member experiences at the monthly meetings. The Junior League of St. Petersburg's 26th (holy cannoli!) Annual Back to School Care Fair was an absolute blast and honor to plan and produce. In a world still recovering from the COVID-19 pandemic, we were so thrilled to continue offering an event like this for our community.

Patrons were welcomed to the Care Fair with pizazz by Library Puppets and Kids Create where they were invited to decorate schoolbox lanyards, hula hoop, make massive bubbles, and decorate the sidewalk with chalk art. This year the event supplied 158 school physicals and 86 dental exams, provided by Evara Health (formerly Community Health Centers of Pinellas) in their beautifully renovated, state-of-the-art medical and dental exam rooms.

Our Street Fair included oodles of entertainment for kids and guardians alike! We proudly welcomed DJ Nick Potts and the Police Athletic League Drumline who kept guests moving and grooving in the summer heat. This year, we were also immensely grateful to bring back the safety section of the fair after a two-year absence. The Safe Kids team from Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital properly fitted kids with free bike helmets and discussed proper car seat installation with guardians while the St. Petersburg Parks and Recreation team shared water safety tips. As Kids in the Kitchen and Kona Ice passed out delicious snacks, the coolest cat around made an appearance. Thanks to the Tampa Bay Rays, kids and adults alike got a chance to have their picture taken with the one and only DJ Kitty. Our pals at the St. Petersburg Fire and Police Departments were also there to give K-9 demonstrations, hand out honorary badges, and let kids climb onto and experience a real-life firetruck! Rounding out the experience and putting an emphasis on healthy, active living were Fit4AllKids, Girls on the Run Tampa Bay, and the St. Pete Run Fest, while Great Explorations challenged kids to exercise their noggins.

It wouldn't be a Care Fair without backpacks! This year, we were honored to present the newly designated Linda Berset Family Backpack Room. Junior League Past President and Sustaining Member, Linda Berset, and her family generously donated to the Care Fair event to fund the backpacks and supplies. We are so thankful to them for their giving spirits! This year we distributed 1,100 backpacks at the fair alone, stuffing backpacks for three age groups and prioritizing items from area teacher lists. In addition to items included in previous fairs, we added zippered pencil bags, water bottles, dry erase markers, fidget toys, index cards, protractors, colored pencils, construction paper, washable markers, and rulers. We were so excited to send kids back to school even more prepared than ever before!

Whether you participated by donating supplies or giving your time, we hope this year's Care Fair touched your heart in some way. Words cannot express how absolutely filled to the brim with pride I am of the service the women of this league have demonstrated.


Veronica Hickey



Hurricane Ian Relief

On Wednesday September 28th, Hurricane Ian made landfall in Southwest Florida as a category 4 Hurricane. Many of us in St. Petersburg evacuated or boarded up our homes to safely hunker down, expecting the storm to cause severe impact to us as it was tracked to hit the local area. Somehow, we were spared and able to return home safely and without major damage but with heavy hearts for our neighbors in Southwest Florida. On Thursday September 29th, we watched the news, showing the destruction and wanted to help but didn't know how. That is when the Executive Team decided to leverage our Junior League network and reach out to the Junior League of Ft. Myers to understand how we could support them and their community.



- collect and distribute over 120 cases of water.
- receive over \$3,000 in gift cards and financial donations to provide directly to the Ft. Myers community,
- provide cleaning supplies, food supplies, toiletries, tarps, blankets, towels, baby items, and clothes to the Ft. Myers' community, and
- collect so many donations we had to coordinate a second shipment!







After the collection drive, a handful of League Members drove down to Ft. Myers to unload the truck and distribute items at a local Aussie Grill while many others worked to collect and deliver the extra supplies to store at Expert Messenger until we were able to drive them down in the second round of distribution. The support of our community, our volunteers, and our League made a huge impact so I would like to extend a huge thank you to everyone who contributed in any way.

On a very personal note October 8th was such an amazing day. I felt that I witnessed a power of love that I've never seen before. I want to share four stories from distributing items in Ft. Myers with you that I thought would make the collection drive feel even more impactful:


- 1. When distributing the items later in the day in Ft. Myers, there were many community members that asked specifically for cleaning supplies, bleach, or Clorox wipes. They shared with us how their homes smelled or how much mold they already had because of the water. One of our volunteers was helping a neighbor load their car when she noticed an odor from the car and immediately realized this vehicle had been submerged in water. The cleaning supplies donated were a huge need for the health and safety of our Ft. Myers neighbors.
- 2. Prior to the truck arriving, some community neighbors were already there, shopping for the items that some volunteers were able to bring via their personal cars. When the Amazon truck arrived, the volunteers we had jumped into place to help unload items. A couple of the community neighbors that were shopping also jumped into action and immediately started helping us to unload the truck. This stuck out to me as an amazing example of how we are all in this together and even in such trying times, people can take what they need while giving what they can.
- 3. There were many community neighbors who shopped for items and we encouraged them to take more. Multiple times they shared with us that they had enough and they wanted to leave items so that others in need had something.
- 4. Lastly, a member we worked very close with in Ft. Myers lost her home and her job in the storm. Despite working to secure housing for herself, she jumped in to lead and volunteer to help us and her League serve the community. I'm amazed by her and she makes me so proud to be part of the Junior League network.

This excerpt shall serve as a thank you to our whole Junior League community and family. I also want to share a token of true appreciation and gratitude for our human community. There are truly kind and giving people in the world. I will continue to hold space in my heart for Ft. Myers and the broader surrounding areas that were impacted by hurricane Ian. We will continue to maintain this newer and close relationship with Junior League Ft. Myers. There is a long road to recovery ahead but they are strong and they are so loved, especially by our St. Pete Community.

Community Advisory Council

The JLSP Community Advisory Council (CAC), comprised of top community leaders, moves into its second year since its re-imagining of strategic advice and guidance to the JLSP Board of Directors under the leadership of our Community Advisory Council Director, Summer Jensen.

The official purposes of the CAC are as follows:

- 1. Help communicate the League Mission and programs to the community as an ambassador.
- 2. Assist in evaluating the effectiveness of existing programs and projects.
- 3. Serve as a sounding board for community opinion and provide expert advice to the League with specific problems or concerns.
- 4. Strengthen the League's public relations within the community.
- 5. Develop a network of potential contributors of expertise, service, funding, and membership recruitment.
- 6. Engage and communicate or provide written feedback in response to proposed topics.
- 7. Participate in community events, fundraisers and other special events as able.
- 8. Provide strategic feedback on planning for the future.

We have been fortunate to retain a large majority of last years' members, and added 2 new members, Jason Jensen, and Laura Zuppo. Our Council roster of 22 people represents a broad cross-section from which to receive advice and guidance. In addition, JLSP Board members are invited to attend these meetings to directly hear from and participate in interacting with our advisors. The information is also presented and discussed at Board meetings to assist with implementation.
